Courses

- I certify that I am a Virginia resident, at least 60 years of age; therefore, I am eligible to take as many as three courses for audit or zero value credit under the Senior Citizens Higher Education Act.
- I certify that I am a Virginia resident, at least 60 years of age and that my taxable income for Virginia income tax purposes was no more than \$15,000 last year; therefore, I am eligible to take courses for academic credit under the Senior Citizens Higher Education Act. I understand that the university may require proof of income eligibility (review of an IRS 1040 Form, for example), if I wish to enroll in courses for academic credit.

The Senior Citizens Higher Education Act provides that any legal resident of the state, who before the beginning of any semester in which he/she claims benefits of the Act, and who has had his/her legal domicile in the state for one year and is sixty years or older, may without paying tuition:

- Register for and enroll in courses for academic credit if he/she had a taxable income not exceeding \$15,000 for Virginia income tax purposes for the preceding year in which enrollment is sought.
- Register for and audit no more than three courses offered for academic credit.
- Register for and enroll in no more than three courses not offered for academic credit.

The tuition-free policy shall apply except that the senior citizen shall be subject to the cost of private music lessons and paying for special course and materials fees (such as textbooks, laboratory, and art fees) and/or program-specific tuition and fees. The cost of the course is covered at the standard undergraduate or graduate rates.

The senior citizen shall be subject to university admission requirements and shall be admitted to a course after all tuition-paying students have been accommodated. The university shall determine whether or not it has the ability to offer the course(s).
