The BIS degree in Liberal Studies for Early and Elementary Education (LSEE) is the approved major for students who plan to enter the Extended Teacher Preparation Program for elementary teaching. The Extended Teacher Preparation Program is designed for undergraduate students to pursue both an undergraduate degree in an approved major and a Master's degree in Teaching. Students apply to the Extended Teacher Preparation Program after they have completed about 70 credits. Completion of the LSEE degree requires students to be admitted into the Teacher Preparation Program. * There are certain courses in the Graduate portion of the LSEE program that will fulfill the undergraduate requirement of 120 credit hours. Please contact the LSEEE advisor about these courses.
