

Management Plan for Childhood Lead Poisoning

IF Blood Lead Levels Are...	ACTION
10 ug/dL or Higher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MANDATORY Reporting to Virginia Department of Health • Provide nutritional education • Provide risk reduction education • Obtain medical history if 20 ug/dL or higher • Refer to local health department for coordinated case Management and environmental intervention if 20 ug/dL or higher • Refer to WIC and Social Services (as needed) <p>Do all of the above for EVERY child with a BLL of 10ug/dL or higher</p>
In addition, if BLL is:	
10-19ug/dL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide follow-up venous testing Within 3 Months
20-44 ug/dL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide follow-up venous testing Every 2 Months or more often as medically necessary • Begin clinical management/ refer to a regional treatment center (Complete medical evaluation, including developmental assessment)
45ug/dL or Higher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide follow-up venous testing ONCE A MONTH or more often as medically necessary • Provide clinical management (Complete medical evaluation, including developmental assessment)
70ug/dL or Higher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hospitalize and begin medical treatment and case management IMMEDIATELY
